Welcome

Hippies give way to yuppies in contemporary Negril

nce upon a time, pirates plied the waters off Punta Negrilla — named by the Spanish for the black conger eels in the rivers, or maybe for the dark cliffs of the West End, depending on who tells the story.

In 1720 the buccaneer Calico Jack Rackham was seized in Negril and hanged in Port Royal. In the 1800s whalers butchered their catches in Bloody Bay, to the north. In 1959 there was still no road to sleepy Negril.

Today, Negril is a tale of two world-class resort towns - beaches to the northeast, cliffs to the southwest — that attract tourists and investors from North America, Europe, and Australia. Our booming resorts have developed in just 40 short years.

In the 1960s, hippies and back-packers

discovered Negril's pristine beaches, funky cliffs, and hallucinogenic sunsets. They slept with local families or under the stars. Some built inns and stayed. They established our casual, tolerant reputation.

In 1977 a major beach resort — now SuperClubs' Hedonism II - opened. Tales of wild toga parties and nude volleyball games spread Negril's fame. Then the Sandals and Couples chains followed. The boom was on.

By the 1990s investors discovered the West End, developing cliff-side boutique properties — Rockhouse and others — for the growing nonconformist market. In 2004 Hurricane Ivan accelerated the trend by forcing even more redevelopment, such as the new construction at Rick's Café.

A few of the original hippies remain, but the future of Negril - more yuppie than hippie — is a booming market for rooms, restaurants, and recreation. 🍸



Vegril is easy to get around. Hugging the coast, about 10 miles from north to south, Negril's three major roads come together at a roundabout called Negril Square.

The flat wide beach road (Norman Manley Boulevard or A1) runs north past the beach resorts to Montego Bay. Narrow winding West End Road (Lighthouse Road) runs southwest past the cliff resorts to the lighthouse and beyond. Urban Sheffield Road (A2) runs inland three miles to the town of Sheffield, then to Savanna-la-Mar.

All it takes to **GET A TAXI** in Negril is to stand by the side of the road for 15 seconds. One will stop to offer a ride. Hold out for licensed cabs with red plates. Negotiate fees with the drivers - specify US or Jamaican dollars — before stepping into the cabs. Failure to do so may result in expensive sur-





island and cross the mountains at several points. Stay left. Most cars are Japanese subcompacts. Rates are US\$50-100 per day. Gas is US\$2.20-2.95 per gallon. Telephone numbers for several agencies are on page 4.

Many resorts include **AIRPORT TRANSFERS** in their rates. Other visitors can use JUTA Tours, which advertise minibus trips between Negril and the airport in Montego Bay for US\$15 with a reservation, 957-4620/ 9197. A taxi might cost US\$70-80.

Several **DOMESTIC AIRLINES** and charters serve Negril Aerodrome on Norman Manley Boulevard. Timair flies groups to Montego Bay, OchoRios, Port Antonio, andKingston. Fares start at US\$66 per person between Negril and Montego Bay, 957-5374.

Readily available services make business here easy

The point of Negril is to get away. But visitorsalsotake care of business here. The Negril Chamber of Commerce can help with faxing, copying, and typing. The Jamaican Dollar floats freely against other currencies. In early 2005 it was 61 to the US Dollar,

79 to the Euro, and 113 to the British Pound. **MONEY** can be exchanged at



many hotels. Two banks on West End Road open 9AM-2PM Monday to Thursday, 9AM-4PM Friday. They are Scotiabank, just west of Negril Plaza, 957-4236, and National Commercial Bank, at Sunshine Village, 957-4117. US Dollars circulate widely in Negril.

Standard **ELECTRICAL SERVICE** is 110 volts. Some hotels also offer 220-volt service. \rightarrow

For most visitors, the only threats to HEALTH are sunburn and dehydration. Use sunscreen and drink plenty of water, which is perfectly safe, and also tastes good.

While fixing up the vacation place, one may need a hammer, a stack of plywood, or various HARDWARE items. Negril Hardware comes in handy, West End Road, 957-4411.

Visitors find INTERNET ACCESS at several cyber spots. Easy Rock Internet Café started as a sideline to a West End restaurant, but demand for internet exceeded demand for food. The café has Windows computers, printer, laptop port, and snacks. E-rates are US\$1.65 for 20 minutes, then US8¢ per minute, 957-0671. Another West End spot is MiYard, with 24-hour food, 957-4442.

In a trailer on Norman Manley Boulevard is Surf 'N Talk. The computers and printer are new and there is a port for laptops. The rate is US\$1 for 15 minutes.

A small public LIBRARY sits on WestEnd Road ¹/₄-mile from the roundabout, 957-4917.

The **POST OFFICE** opens 8AM to 5PM, Monday to Friday, on West End Road about 1000 feet from the roundabout, 957-9654.

Making **TELEPHONE CALLS** from Negril has become easy and inexpensive.


International roaming allows GSM phones to work in Jamaica when the feature is enabled. To use an AT&T Wireless phone, for example, costs US\$1.69 per minute in Jamaica. Digicel — competitor to the utility Cable & Wireless — claims the largest number of roaming agreements here. Digicel also rents phones at hotels and car rental agencies, and sells prepaid minutes through numerous outlets. The peak rate per minute to call another Digicel subscriber is US16¢. To a land line is US19¢. To almost every other country is US29¢. Frequent visitors can purchase a phone from US\$38.888-DIGICEL.

Many hotels charge reasonable rates to make phone calls from their rooms. At Rondel Village, for example, rates are US\$2.44 for three minutes to the USA or Western Europe, US49¢ per minute locally, and a flat US81¢ to make an 800 call.


Where to stay? Beach or cliffs? All-inclusive or small boutique?

Reach-side or cliff-side? All-inclusive or small boutique? These are the first two questions that visitors must answer.

Most vacationers assume that a great Caribbean resort would beon a **GREAT BEACH.** For them, Negril's northern beaches may be best in all the Caribbean: long and broad, white and powdery, warm refreshing water, and fun for the kids.

CLIFF-SIDE Negril, however, is for people who do not make such assumptions. They enjoy the winding roads, tropical canopy, natural caves, funky architecture, sunset views from

high rocky perches, sunbathing decks carved out of the cliffs, jumping-off cliffs into clear emerald waters, and real Jamaican neighbors nearby.

Rick's Café, one of several venues, is practically a stadium for such activity. All it takes to jump is enough rum to overcome one's better judgement.

Each morning many independent guides in small skiffs ply the beaches and rivers offering **FISHING** trips to visitors. To arrange a deep-sea trip for wahoo, tuna, blue marlin, or sailfish, contact Stanley's Deep Sea Fishing, 957-0667.

A uniquely Jamaican adventure is HORSEBACK RIDING through the sea. Rhodes Hall Plantation also offers tours through banana and coconut groves, and rides high up into the hills. Five miles northeast of Negril, 867-957-6883.

The historic **NEGRIL LIGHTHOUSE** still warns ships to stay away from treacherous





West Point. Only now the modern lamp runs on solar power. Inside the tower a mini-museum displays artifacts like the original kerosene lamp from 1894. Visitors who climb the steep 103 steps to the top of the 66-foot tower are rewarded with beautiful views of cliff-side Negril. Open daily at no charge, West End Road (also known as Lighthouse Road) three miles southwest of the roundabout.

Neither beach nor cliffs, but a totally other kind of Jamaican experience, are the **RIVERS** and **WATERFALLS** high up in the mountains. Visitors climb up falls, wade through rivers, swim in natural pools, and commune thoroughly with the environment. Mayfield Falls and Mineral Springs, 957-4864 /971-6580. Unique fruits, veggies, spices make for culinary adventure

The first-time Negril visitor takes a spoonful of the soup, grins broadly, and pronounces, "It's like a warm, savory version of pumpkin pie."

Pumpkin soup does not actually come from the guts of jack-o-lanterns... more like big orange squashes. Typical Jamaican fare relies on many

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

largely unknown in Europe and North America. Ackee, a tree fruit native to Africa, cooks up like scrambled eggs and makes its way into many dishes. Callaloo, served aside nearly every localdish, looks and tasteslike spinach. There are so many fruits in this Garden of Eden: breadfruit (starch to boil, bake, or roast), guava (musky sweet), guinep (like a grape), mango (sweet and slippery), papaya (like a melon with edible black seeds), soursop (acidic flavour in desserts), star apple (mildly sweet purple tennis ball), ugli (like a deformed grapefruit), and others.


JERK BARBECUE is the quintessential Jamaican flavour. Jerking adds kick to chicken, lamb, pork, fish, even vegetables. But the seasoning is more complex than just a fiery scotch bonnet pepper. It fuses scallions, black pepper, allspice, nutmeg, and more. Jerk

seasoning is to hot sauce, as fine wine is to grape juice. Visitors can stock up on native seasonings at supermarkets or gift shops. The staple of fast food here is the

JAMAICAN PATTY — a pastry crust filled with chicken, fish, veggies, whatever, then baked or fried. In Latin America it might be called an *empanada*. Here it ranges from agreeably

mild to aggressively spicy. Java snobs agree that **BLUE MOUNTAIN COFFEE** may be the best in the world —

rich but not bitter; smooth but not wimpy. Perfect beans result from the skill and care of the workers, plus the cool temperatures, abundant sunshine, rich soil, and gentle rainfall in the Blue Moun-

tains of eastern Jamaica. At the rate of US\$40per pound in the USA, it had better be great.

While JAMAICAN RUM is exported worldwide, it costs a third less on the island. Stock up on Appleton and Myers's rums and Tia Maria liqueur. Spirits from around the world are also discounted. Available at airport and gift shops, take home as many bottles as customs and luggage will allow.

Piquant Jamaican **SEASONINGS** and heavenly **BLUE MOUNTAIN COFFEE** can be purchased in Negril, then spread around

as welcomed gifts back home. While sold at many gift shops, a good place to stock up is the supermarket at Sunshine Village on West End Road, 957-4546.

Every shop and roadside vendor sells the fun **SOUVENIRS** that prove one really visited Jamaica --bags, caps, dolls, dresses, mugs, shirts, shorts, shots, towels — printed with shells, flowers, or reggae colors. Visitors become investors: Rockhouse adopts school

ike most visitors to Negril, Paul Salmon was "seducedbythetown's charmsthe incredible beauty of its location, the amazing cliffs and caves, the strong identity of its people, their love for life."

Like most, he fantasized about buying a little resort and spending his days here. But unlike most, he actually did it.

It was the early 1990s, dawn of a new trend in travel toward boutique hotels. He saw this niche in Negril. He and two other investors purchased 12 well-worn cottages on the cliffs. After much expansion and renovation - using native timber, thatch, and

stone - the hip new Rockhouse cliff-side resort appeared with 20 outrageous villas, five luxurious studios, and nine standard rooms.

It also boasts a "new Jamaican" restaurant, big comfy bar, fabulous pool, spa cabana, activities, 8.5 acres, 70 staff members, and worldwide reputation for service.

As foreigners, how hard was it to purchasepropertyandestablish a newbusiness? "It wasstraightforward," shrugs Salmon,

who worked on WallStreet."JamPro was very helpful," referring to the agency that facilitates investment. "There were no major challenges. I expected it to be more difficult." In exchange for the opportunity, Negril

gets a great corporate citizen. Salmon also chairs Rockhouse Foundation, which adopted the Negril All Age School. "Our objective was not just a hotel, but also to be responsible investors in a developing economy like Jamaica's... responsible to the environment... the staff... the people."

In 2004 the foundation worked with school, chamber of commerce, and government officials to construct

1200 square feet of new classroom space, and to install new electrical service, roofing, doors, windows, paint, fencing, and furnishings. They also got the US Agency for International Development to donate money, the US embassy to donate computers, and the Peace Corps to donate a volunteer.
